Jasmin Daryani's practice—which encompasses photography, film and poetry—evinces an engagement with the poetics of métissage: a means of writing and surviving between multiple conditions and contexts.

Daryani explore the social, linguistic and political construction of power, migration and belonging. Through methods of repetition and reconstructions, personal and collective experiences in relation to the present and history are depicted.

Notions of rootlessness, regeneration, and renewal are recurring themes in her work. Displacement and alterity is also present, as the growing resentment. It is testimonies from her everyday life, own experiences or people in her community.
